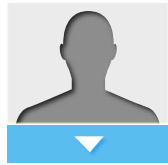

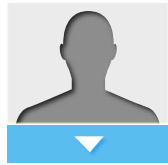

SINUSITIS

DSA/ICSI guideline key points: 7 days of symptoms in addition to at least two of the following: Sinus pressure Did your other symptoms start BEFORE the facial pressure? Fever Headache [Mild to moderate] OR Sinusitis symptoms for 10 days or more

Afrin

- ☐ Afrin X 3 days
- ☐ Afrin + Flonase

Augmentin

- ☐ Augmentin 875 mg po bid X 10 days

INFLUENZA

- ☐ No anti-viral: onset >48 hrs

oseltamivir (TAMIFLU)

Antiviral treatment recommended for persons with suspected or confirmed influenza who are at higher risk for influenza complications including: Adults 65+, Children < 2 years old, and others.

- ☐ Treatment: Tamiflu 75 mg po bid X 5 days
- ☐ Prophylaxis: Tamiflu 75 mg po 1/day X 10 days
